Indicator approach	
<p>The focus of measurement for this indicator is on quality of PAR implementation, coordination and monitoring from the perspective of civil society engagement.</p> <p>Strategic PAR document whose coordination and monitoring structured are monitored and measured by this indicator, is overall PAR strategic document. Focus on the single strategic document, instead of two or more determines at the same time whether efforts to simplify monitoring and coordination structures for different PAR strategic documents exist. In case there is no overall PAR strategy, the most comprehensive strategic document in force and under implementation is considered.</p> <p>For each element under this indicator, review and qualitative assessment of official documents pertaining to the organisation and functioning of PAR coordination and monitoring structures will be conducted. Findings from other data sources, where applicable, will be used to corroborate the findings from the official documents.</p>	
Summary of the findings	
<p>The Ministry of Public Administration is responsible for coordinating and monitoring of the PAR process. The framework for PAR consists of 4 main strategies: 1) Strategy for Modernization of Public Administration 2016-2020, 2) Strategy for Improving Planning and Policy Coordination 2017-2021, 3) Strategy for Public Finance Management Reform 2016-2020 and 4) Strategy for Better Regulation 2017-2021. Administrative and political structures are stipulated in the government's Decision on Organization and Monitoring of Ministerial Council for Public Administration Reform (MCPAR) and Responsible Structures for Coordination, Monitoring and Implementation (RSCMI) of PAR Strategic Documents. Nevertheless, administrative structures are not operational or functional yet.</p> <p>Management within the Ministry of Public Administration is responsible for coordination and monitoring of PAR strategic documents. No explicit involvement of CSOs in the administrative or political structures for PAR coordination and monitoring is foreseen in the Government decision on PAR structures. Moreover, none of four PAR strategic documents reference CSOs involvement in any of the PAR coordination and monitoring structures. However, the government decision on MCPAR states that the head of the Ministerial Council has the right to invite representatives of other institutions and organisations if the issues to be discussed fall within the scope of work of such organisations (relevant institutions).</p> <p>Although none of the strategies foresee explicit involvement of CSOs in PAR coordination and monitoring structures, Article 5 of the Regulation on Minimum Standards for Public Consultations process states that all draft strategies are subject to public consultation process.</p>
